
Land acknowledgment

Transfer questions from Slido


Export poll results from Slido:


- Log into Slido. Click on a Slido event and then Analytics > Export > Download export > Poll results (XLS)
- With the Slido export file you can either...
 - Manually format it so that it matches Vevox import template file OR
 - Copy and paste your questions and answer choices from the Slido export file into Vevox

 OR
 - Use Slido-Vevox converters (developed by Queen's University Belfast)


If you will be giving **participation grades**, you **must** do the following steps **before** you run your polling questions in class.

- You will need to link your Vevox activity/polling questions (e.g. lecture 1) to your course in myCourses.




